

1 BANDULA WARNAPURA (1975 - 1982)

He was also a useful allrounder. an able leader and Sri Lanka gained Test tatus during his captaincy. His illustrious playing career ended when he participated in a rebel tour to aparthied South Africa in October 1982.



Wettimuny scored the first Test century for Sri Lanka. He also became the first Sri Lankan batsman to carry his bat through an innings in both ODI and Test formats. His record shows he was a far more effective player on overseas wickets. After retirement Wettimuny involved in the

game initially as a match referee, an adminstrator and a selector.


