- Enforcement of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel in circumstances which fall outside the jurisdiction of the referee.
- Approval of the granting of leave of absence to team members.

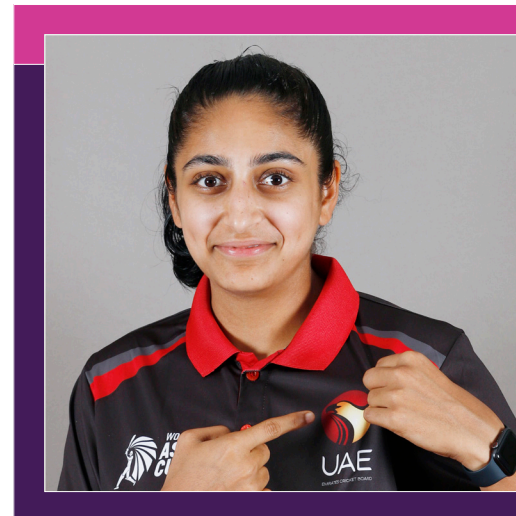

PLAYING CONDITIONS

Standard T20 Match Playing Conditions

ACC Women's Standard T/20 Playing Conditions –Effective from 1st January 2024

Incorporating the 2017 Code of the MCC Laws of Cricket. – 03rd Edition 2022

Code of Conduct

The ICC code of conduct is adopted and implemented as part of the ACC continuing efforts to maintain the public image, popularity and integrity of cricket by providing an effective means to deter any participant from conducting themselves improperly on the field of play or in a manner that is contrary to the Spirit of cricket

Note: all references to “Governing Body” within the Laws of Cricket shall be replaced by ACC Match Referee.

Match Balls

Kookaburra Turf White Balls shall be used for all T/20 Matches
The ball when new shall weigh not less than 4.94 Ounces/140 gms nor more than 5.31ounces/151 gms and shall measure not less than 8.25 inch/21.0 cm nor more than 8.88 inch/22.5 cm in circumference

Nomination of Players

Each Captain shall nominate 11 players and a maximum of 04 players as substitutes to the ACC Match Referee in writing.

*** Hours of Play Day**

First Match

02.00 pm to 03.15 pm – (First Session)

03.15 pm to 03.30 pm – (Interval)

03.30 pm to 04.45 pm – (Second Session)

Second Match

07.00 pm to 08.15 pm – (First Session)

08.15 pm to 08.30 pm – (Interval)

08.30 pm to 09.45 pm – (Second Session)

Extra Time: In a match where play is delayed or interrupted. The hours of play shall be extended by 30 minutes.

Use of artificial lights:

Artificial Lights will be used during the matches.

Tie

If the scores are equal, the result will be a tie and no account shall be taken of the number of wickets which have fallen.

Timed Out

The incoming batter must be in position to take guard or for her partner to be ready to receive the ball within 90 seconds of the fall of previous wicket.

Points

Win	02
Tie or No result.....	01
Loss.....	00

In the event of teams finishing on equal points in the league, the right to play in the Semi-finals will be decided in the following order of priority.

- The teams with highest points in the league stage will be placed in the higher position.
- If there are teams with equal points in the league stage the team with higher net rate in the league stage will be placed in the higher position.
- If still equal it will be decided by a toss of a coin

Semi Final

Semi Final 1 will be played between of A1 and B2

Semi Final 2 will be played between of B1 and A2.

If there is no result in the Semi- Final, the team with the highest net run rate in the Preliminary round shall be the winner.

Where there still remains equal, the toss of a coin will decide the winner.

Final

In the event of a tied final, the teams shall compete in a super over or a series of Super Overs to determine which team is the winner. If the weather prevents the one over eliminator from being completed the team shall be declared as joint champions.

Net Run Rate

- A team's net run rate is calculated by deducting from the average runs per over scored by that team if still equal, the team with the highest net run rate.

Throughout the competition, the average runs per over scored against that team throughout the competition. In the event of a team being all out in less than its full quota of overs, the calculation of its net run rate shall be based on the full quota of overs to which it would have been entitled and not on the number of overs in which the team was dismissed. Only those matches where results are achieved will count for the purpose of net run rate calculations. Where a match is abandoned, but a result is achieved under Duckworth/Lewis, for net run rate purposes Team 1 will be accredited with Team 2's par score on abandonment off the same number of overs faced by Team 2. Where a match is concluded but with Duckworth/Lewis having been applied at an earlier point in the match, Team 1 will be accredited with 1 run less than the final Target score for team 2 off the total number of overs to Team 2 to reach the target.

Note: net run rate is not applied to the Super Over.

Power Play

During the Power Play overs only two fielders shall be permitted outside this fielding restriction area at the instant of delivery.

During the non-Power Play overs, no more than 4 fieldsmen shall be permitted outside the fielding restriction area.

In circumstances when the number of overs of the batting team is reduced, the number of Power Play overs shall be reduced in accordance with the table below. For the sake of clarity, it should be noted that the table shall apply to both the 1st and 2nd innings of the match.

Total overs in in-nings	Number of overs for fielding restrictions
5-8	2
9-11	3
12-14	4
15-18	5
19-20	6

If an innings is interrupted during an over and if on the resumption of play, due to the reduced number of overs of the batting team, the required number of Power Play overs has already been bowled, the remaining deliveries in the over to be completed shall not be subject to the fielding restrictions.

In the event of an infringement of any of the above fielding restrictions, the square leg umpire shall call and signal 'No Ball'.

Fielders Position

Two Semi-circles should be drawn on the field of play. The Semi-circles should have as their centre of the middle stump at either end of the pitch. The radius of each of the semi-circles shall be 25.15yds (23 Meters). The two semi-circles shall be linked by two parallel straight lines drawn on the field.

Boundary

No Boundary shall be longer than 70 yds. (64 meters) and no boundary shall be shorter than 60 yds. (54.86 meters) from the centre of the pitch used.

Over Rate Penalties:

IORP – penalties will apply

Drinks Break

- One Drinks Interval of 2 mins and 30 seconds will be taken at the mid-point of an Innings.
- Only the Head coach may consult with the on-field players for tactical reasons during the Drinks Break

Penalty Time

A Players' unexpired penalty time shall be limited to a maximum of 35 minutes.

Minimum over Rates

In addition to the allowances as provided for above, in the case of an innings that has been reduced due to any delay or interruption in play, an additional allowance of 1 minute for every full 3 overs by which the innings is reduced will be granted.

An additional allowance of 1 minute will be given for each of the 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th wickets taken during an innings.

If a batting team is bowled out within the time determined for that innings pursuant to these playing conditions (taking into account all of the time allowances set out above), the fielding side shall be deemed to have complied with the required minimum over rate.

The current over rate of the fielding team (+/- overs compared to

the minimum rate required), to be advised by the 3rd umpire every 20 minutes as a minimum, shall be displayed on a scoreboard or replay screen.

Number of Overs per Bowler

No bowler shall bowl more than 4 overs in an innings.

In a delayed or interrupted match where the overs are reduced for both teams or for the team bowling second;

For innings of rescheduled length of at least 10 overs, no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed. Where the total overs is not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the maximum number per bowler necessary to make up the balance.

For innings of rescheduled length of between 5 and 9 overs, no bowler may bowl more than two overs. In the event of a bowler breaking down and being unable to complete an over, the remaining balls will be allowed by another bowler. Such part of an over will count as a full over only in so far as each bowler's limit is concerned. The scoreboard shall show the total number of overs bowled and the number of overs bowled by each bowler

Over-Rate Penalties

- The fielding side shall be in position to bowl the first ball of the final over of the innings by the (re)scheduled cessation time for the innings.
- In delayed or interrupted matches (reduction of 3 or more overs):

the penultimate over of the innings shall start by the (re)scheduled cessation time for the innings

- If (a) or (b) above are not met, no more than 3 fielders shall be permitted outside the fielding restriction area.
- In delayed or interrupted matches (Innings of 10 overs or less), In-match penalty not applicable.
- Over-rate penalties as above shall be applied in addition to the relevant provisions under the ICC Code of Conduct.

Dangerous and unfair Bowling

The Bowling of Fast Short Pitched Balls

- a) A bowler shall be limited to one fast short-pitched delivery per over
- b) A fast short-pitched delivery is defined as a ball which passes or would have passed above the shoulder height of the striker standing upright at the popping

Free Hit

A free hit will be given for 'No Balls'

Pre Series Meeting & Pre Match Briefings:

Captains meeting's the date & time will be decided in consultation with the Asia Cricket Council Committee and teams will be notified in due course.



TOURNAMENT SECURITY

Tournament Security

Aim

The Aim of this Security Plan is to ensure safety and security of the players, match officials and all stakeholders of the tournament during their stay in Sri Lanka.

The strategic objectives of this plan is to:

- Ensure incident free run of matches during the tournament and to ensure a secured environment.
- To ensure safety and security of all the players, match officials from the time they arrive in Sri Lanka until their departure.
- To ensure a collaborative and intelligence led approach to safety and security throughout the period for all stakeholders.
- Enable the tour to be conducted efficiently, safely and maintain a consistent standard of security across all matches, hotels and training venues.

Outline Plan

Ministry of Public Security with the coordination of Ministry of Defence will provide the threat assessment report to the SLC and the security plan is formulated as per the threat assessment. Based on the security plan, Sri Lanka Police act as the lead agency for the safety and security for the tour. As per the threat and the Government rules and regulations, they will determine the resources that are required to maintain the safety and security commitments during the tour.

The total security is under a unified command. The SLC security team will closely coordinate with Sri Lanka Police and all the other stakeholders to implement this Security Plan. The Senior Manager Security at SLC will be the focal point of contact for all security issues and he will work in close coordination with security representatives of the arriving teams and other local security agencies.

The tournament will be conducted within the Central Province of Sri Lanka. Therefore, Senior DIGs of the Central Province DIG Mahinda Dissanayake will be the overall commander in providing security for the tournament.

Tournament venue will have Sri Lanka Police, its specialized departments and hired private security companies providing security as per the decided security plan. The service of the Dambulla Fire Departments will be obtained on match days.

Security/ Safety Guidelines

1. All participating teams/match officials will be provided security by Sri Lanka Police and their specialized units at Hotels, Match Venues, Practice Venues and during Internal Travel.
2. All teams/match officials will be escorted by Police(MSD/ STF) during official internal travel.
3. All hotels occupied by teams/match officials will be security cleared and will come under security surveillance of the Police (MSD/STF) until departure of teams.
4. All floor areas of hotels occupied by teams/match officials will be restricted for visitors and guests unless sanctioned by the Team Manager through TSLO.
5. Gifts, letters and packages received for players will be scrutinized by the Security and will be delivered through the Team Manager.

6. Players and Match Officials are advised to handover their valuable articles, cash, etc to the hotel management to be kept in the lockers unless room lockers are available for this purpose.
7. SLC will not be responsible for the safety and security of players/match officials for personal journeys or other engagements.
8. Any issues of security concern players and match officials to contact Senior Manager Security SLC through the liaison officer of respective teams.

ANTI CORRUPTION

The ICC has a zero tolerance approach to corruption in the game and vows to maintain absolute integrity in the Tournament.

- Extensive anti-corruption detection and counter measures will be operating throughout the tournament.
- The ACU needs your help to eradicate this menace and keep the game clean.
- Please ensure that an 'approach' or any suspicion of corruption is reported to the ICC ACU immediately.
- An ACU staff will be present at both the venues. A representative of the ACU is present at all matches and a 24 hour Hotline +971 56 5458909 will be maintained during the tournament for players, officials, media and members of the public to give confidential information relating to any suspicious or corrupt activity.
- ACU can also be contacted via email at contactACU@icc-cricket.com.
- ICC Minimum Standards for Players & Match Officials Area (PMOA) will be enforced throughout the Tournament.
- The PMOA is treated as a separate area from the rest of the venue in terms of accreditation and security. Each entrance into the area will be manned by security staff at all times and access will only be permitted to squad members, match officials and a limited number of individuals who have been allocated specific accreditation for the area.

- The PMOA area is defined as the following:

Dressing Rooms,
Players' and Match Officials' dining areas,
Players' external match viewing areas,
TV/Third Umpire Area,
Match Referee's Room,
Dugouts,

Any other area identified by the Anti-Corruption Manager

- The Dressing rooms are solely for the playing squad, manager, coach and other support staff. All of these personnel will have Team Accreditation and must be wearing this to travel on the team bus and must show it to security on their arrival at the venue.
- Security will have been briefed to check all personnel and will refuse entry to anyone not wearing a valid pass (this includes players).
- Once in the PMOA area, players and coaches may remove their accreditation, but all support staff must wear their accreditation at all times.
- Players, player support personnel and match officials should not leave the PMOA or the Playing Areas at any time before the conclusion of the match, without the prior permission of either: (a) the ICC's Anti-Corruption Manager; or (b) where the ICC's Anti-Corruption Manager is unavailable, the relevant team manager (in the case of a Player or Player Support Personnel) or Match Referee (in the case of a Match Official),

who must immediately report the grant of any such permission to the ICC's Anti-Corruption Manager

- Each entrance to the PMOA will have clear accreditation signage and headshot boards in place. Only those personnel appropriately accredited will be allowed access.
- No mobile phones or electronic communication equipment will be permitted in the PMOA (except for the certain persons as specified in the Minimum Standards). Any communication device taken to the stadium must be collected by the Team Security Manager (TSM) or by Team liaison officers and kept securely until the end of the match.
- When it comes to the issue of corruption, there can be no complacency. It poses a significant risk to the credibility of the game and erodes spectator support.

The captain, player of the match, Player of the final, or players to receive special awards (if applicable) should be present at every post-match presentation.

FLASH INTERVIEWS

The managers of each team must designate a player or players for flash interviews during games or inning breaks, as per the requests of the broadcasters.

MEDIA CONFERENCES

- ACC will hold media conferences with captains, players, and coaches only when necessary and at appropriate times.

PHOTOGRAPHS

- A joint photograph of all 8 captains will be taken along with the trophy at a designated date and time.
- The two finalists will pose with the trophy before the final game, at least one day before, to deliver it to the media.
- A group photograph of the two finalists is to be taken before the commencement of the final game (if it falls in line with the match schedule).

Ambulance and paramedical staff will be available for any emergency during the match.

Medical Cover on match days will include the following at every match venue

- 1 match day doctor (MDD)
- 4 Paramedic (Accident and Emergency Attendant, Critical care Attendant)
- 1 Ambulance driver
- An ambulance will be stationed at every matchday venue with all the requisite emergency, resuscitation, and medical equipment drugs.
- Closer to the boundary line and ambulance the medical room (Tent) will be located.
- CMO will be stand by on each match day

Match Day Medical Meeting Agenda

- General information and tournament specific medical information
- Introduction of the medical team present at the match and their mobile numbers with the radio access
- Location of the medical room for players as well as match officials with the ambulance position
- Reiterate chain of command in emergency and non-emergency situations
- Reiterate the availability of the following items in the ambulance:
Defibrillator(s) Oxygen cylinder, regulator and oxygen mask, along with giving bag set
